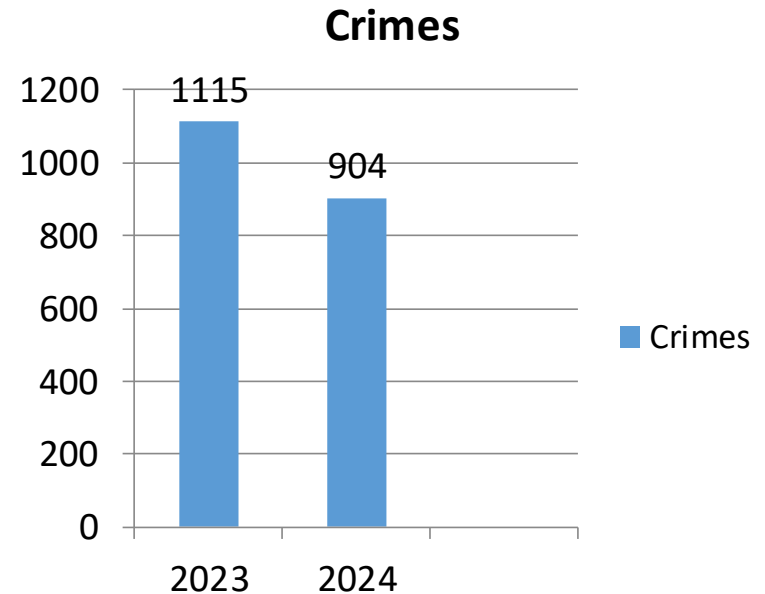

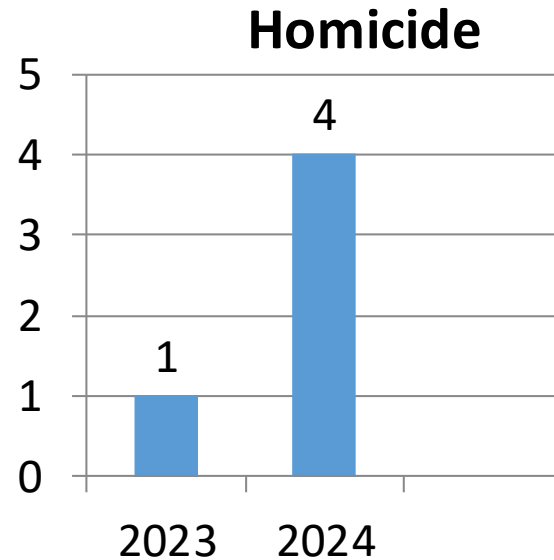

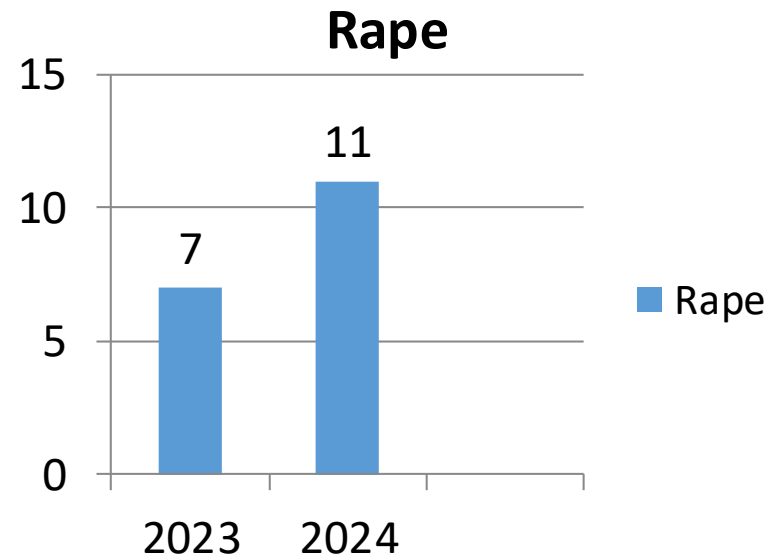

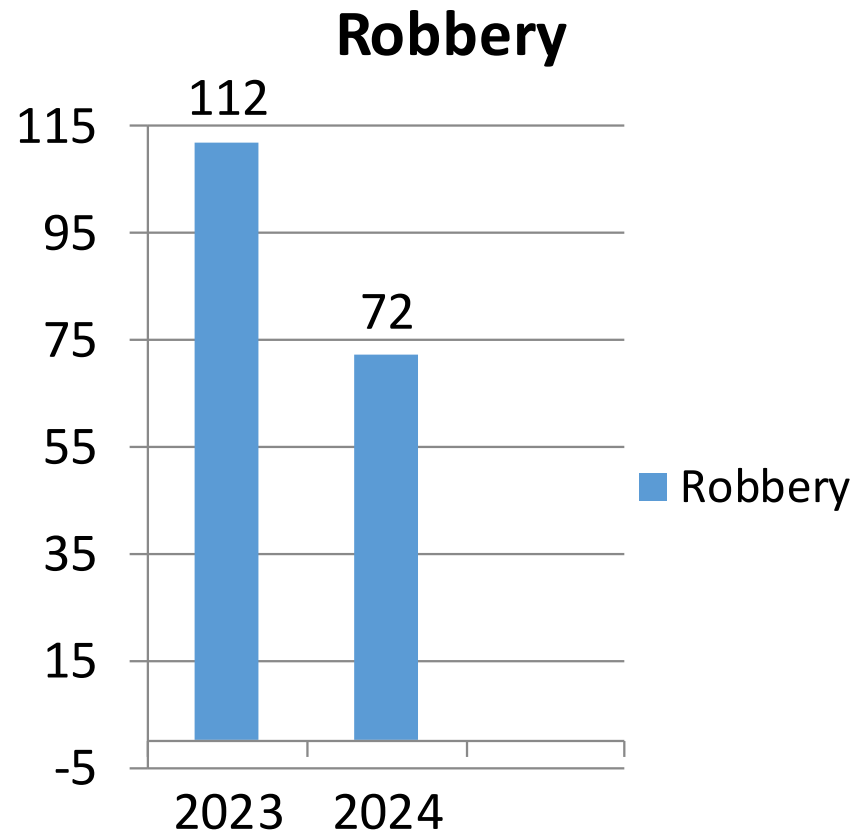
Seven Major Index Crimes/Robbery

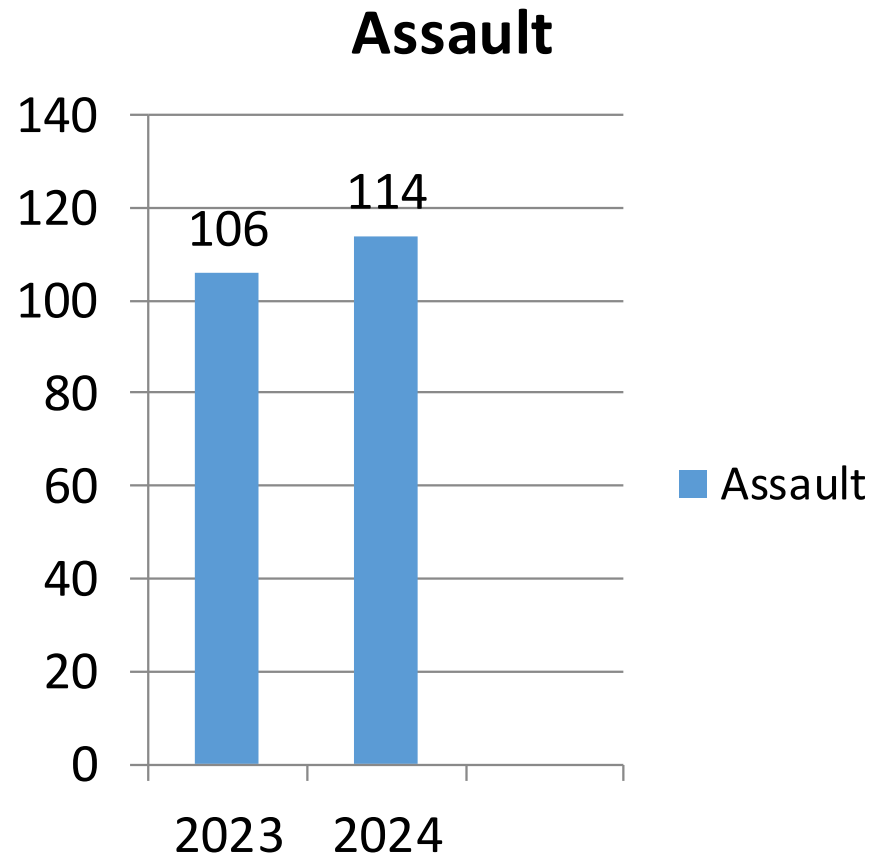
Seven Major Index Crimes/Assault

Year to date change

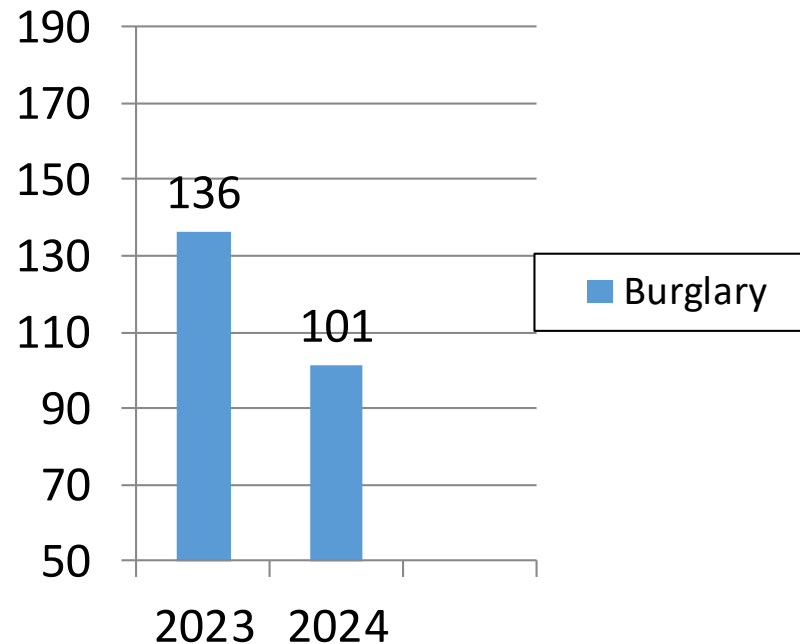

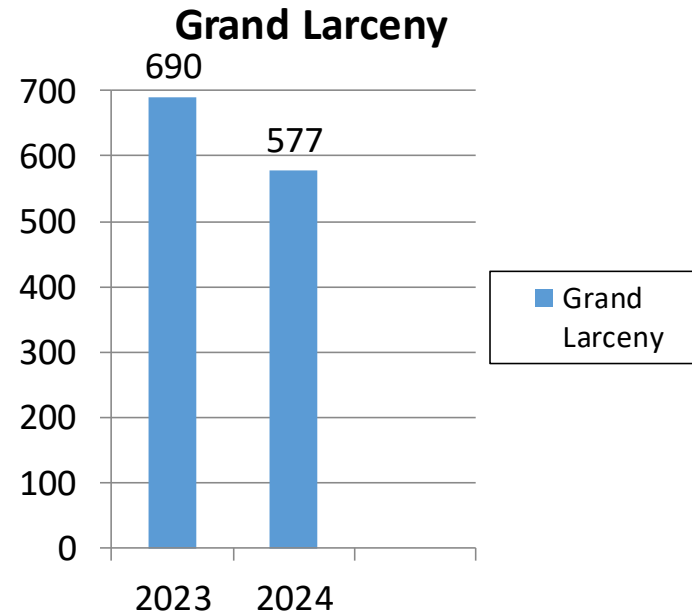
Seven Major Index Crimes/Grand Larceny

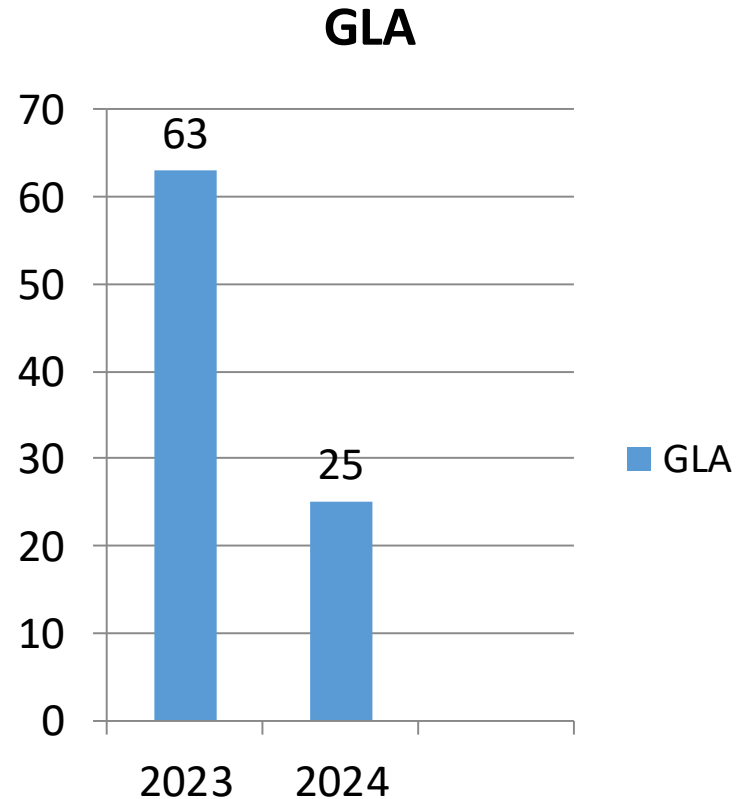
Seven Major Index Crimes/G.L.A.

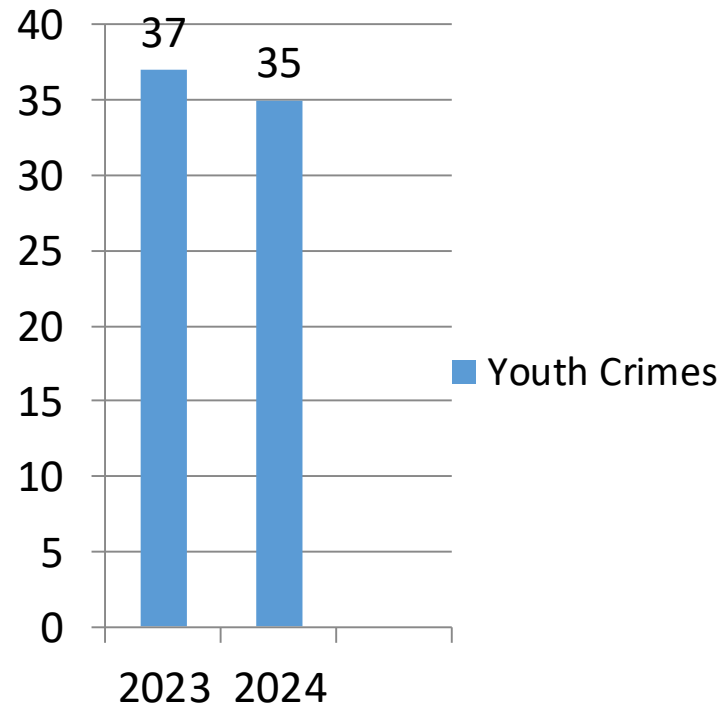


Youth Crimes

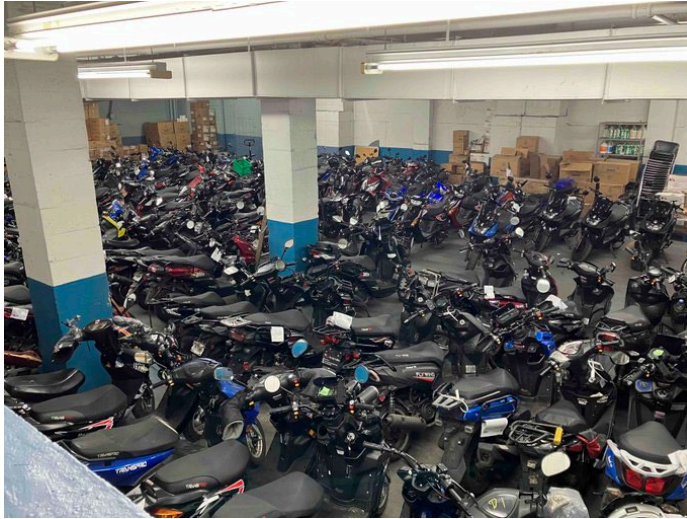


Top Moving Violations

Cars/ Motorcycles/ Trucks

1. 575 Speed Over Posted Limit
(Driving Over 25 MPH - Unless otherwise posted.)
2. 316 Disobey Traffic Device- Pavement Markings
(When a Driver Ignores a line, arrow or other marking on the Road)
3. 257 Failed To Yield to Vehicles / Pedestrian
(Failing to Yield right of way to other Vehicles or Pedestrians in roadway)
4. 199 Improper Turns
(Making Right/Left Turn from any lane other than designated turning lane)
5. 182 NYC Red Light
(Proceeding through the stop point after the traffic device has transitioned to Solid Red)
6. 180 Unlicensed Operator
(Driving without a valid drivers license)
7. 172 Improper Right Turn at Intersection
(Failing to make Right Turn from the most right-hand lane)

Top Moving Violations

Bicycle /Scooter

1. 361 Bike Failed to Yield to Vehicle / Pedestrian
(Failing to Yield right of way to other Vehicles or Pedestrians in roadway)
2. 326 Bike Failed to Stop- Red Light
(Proceeding through the stop point after the traffic device has transitioned to Solid Red)
3. 120 Disobey Traffic Device while Operating Bicycle
(When a Cyclist fails to follow traffic sign, signal or pavement markings)
4. 29 Bike/Skate on sidewalk-NYC
(Operating a bike or Skateboard on a public sidewalk over the age of 12)
5. 24 Bicycle Fail to Yield right of way to Pedestrian Crosswalk
(Cyclist fails to allow pedestrian to proceed through intersection)

Quality Of Life Summons



1. 804 Unlawful Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages
(Consuming Alcoholic Beverages in open view of the public)
2. 301 Unlawful Bicycle Riding on Sidewalk
(Operating a Bike on Public Sidewalk over the age of 12)
3. 173 Operation of Motorized Scooter - NYC
(Operating Motorized Scooter in NYC without proper License, Registration and Insurance)
4. 170 Failure to Comply with Bicycle Riding Restriction
(Breaking any of the laws that regulate Bicycles in the city. Examples On Sidewalk, Fail to Yield, Riding against Traffic, Running Red Lights.)
5. 125 Fail to Display License and/ or Plate
(Any License plate that is Missing, Improperly Displayed, Mutilated, Covered or Dirty so it cannot be clearly seen)

- Maintain order at parades, festivals, street fairs, and other special events
- Patrol houses of worship
- Assist in crime prevention activities
- Perform traffic control at motor vehicle accidents and fire scenes
- Perform various other non-enforcement duties

As part of the auxiliary police training course, candidates are trained in self-defense tactics, CPR and first aid, patrol techniques, the New York State Penal Law, and much more.

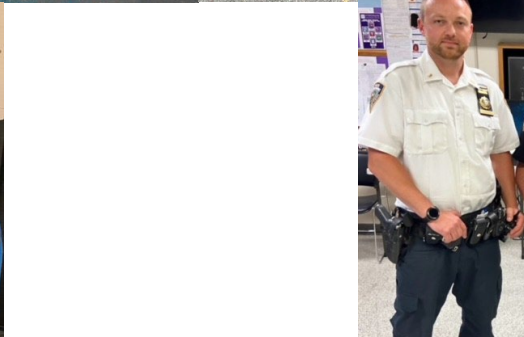
